The Low Twelve Club is an organization of Master
Masons, maintained for the purpose of assisting the
widows or other dependents of its members. Upon
the death of a member a sum not exceeding 2 dollars
per member is paid to the widow or other person
designated. Such payment is made within twenty-four
hours, and is intended primarily for the purpose of
helping defray the funeral expenses.

The club has no regular dues. Its fund is maintained
by assessments of 2 dollars per member, which are
levied from time to time, whenever required. It will
be the policy of the directors to levy an assessment
each time a benefit is paid; but as the membership

increases and funds accumulate, fewer assessments
may be required.

Application for membership will be received from
any Master Mason who has not reached the age of 60
years, and who is a member of any of the Masonic
bodies of Green Bay, Wisconsin and vicinity and any
Master Mason who resides within the jurisdiction of
the Masonic bodies of Green Bay, Wisc., and
vicinity. Admission to membership however is
controlled by the Board of Directors, which may
either accept or reject the application.

Application for membership must be made in the
legal form prescribed by the Board of Directors and
shall be accompanied by a remittance of two dollars.

The benefits paid by the Club are not insurance, and
should not be regarded as such. They are rather a
means by which the members of the Masonic
fraternity may help each other. We may not all be in
need of such assistance, but who can tell when and
where the need exists? Such help is often the most
welcome where we least suspect it might be needed.
Only by giving to all can we help those whose wants
are hidden from the public view. For this reason we
desire the membership of all, regardless of their
needs or circumstances.

The assessments are not insurance premiums. You do
not pay them for what you can get out of the Club.
They are not an investment, but a contribution. We
pay them in hope that they may lighten some
widow's burden; and if we, at the same time, provide
for our own dependents, we may regard such benefits
as merely incidental. Only by providing for all can
we reach those whom we wish to help.

The plan of operation is extremely simple; and the
cost of membership is very low, compared with the
good that can be accomplished. Will you help in this
worthy undertaking?
